

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4137, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. HOEKSTRA OF MICHIGAN**

Title VI amendments

Page 461, after line 25 insert the following new subsection (and redesignate the succeeding subsections accordingly):

1 (d) APPLICATION REQUIREMENT.—Section 602 is
2 further amended by adding at the end the following new
3 subsection:

4 “(e) APPLICATION.—Each institution or combination
5 of institutions desiring a grant under this section shall
6 submit an application to the Secretary at such time, in
7 such manner, and accompanied by such information and
8 assurances as the Secretary may require. Each application
9 shall include a description of how the applicant will en-
10 courage government service in areas of national need, as
11 identified by the Secretary, as well as in needs in the edu-
12 cation, business, and nonprofit sectors.”.

Page 463, after line 11, insert the following new paragraph (and redesignate the succeeding paragraphs accordingly):

13 (5) in subsection (a)(7) —

1 (A) in subparagraph (C), by striking
2 “and” at the end;

3 (B) in subparagraph (D), by inserting
4 “and” at the end; and

5 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (D)
6 the following new subparagraph:

7 “(E) include a description of how the ap-
8 plicant will encourage government service in
9 areas of national need, as identified by the Sec-
10 retary, as well as in needs in the education,
11 business, and nonprofit sectors.”;

Page 463, beginning on line 15, strike subsection (f)
and insert the following:

12 (f) RESEARCH; STUDIES; ANNUAL REPORT.—Section
13 605 (20 U.S.C. 1125) is amended—

14 (1) in subsection (a), by inserting before the pe-
15 riod at the end of the first sentence the following:
16 “, including the systematic collection, analysis, and
17 dissemination of data”;

18 (2) by redesignating subsections (a) and (b) as
19 subsections (b) and (c), respectively; and

20 (3) by inserting before such redesignated sub-
21 section (b) the following:

22 “(a) REQUIRED SURVEY.—The Secretary shall de-
23 velop, in consultation with grantees under section 602(b)

1 of this title, a standardized survey to determine post-grad-
2 uation employment or training. All students who have re-
3 ceived fellowships under section 602(b) shall be required
4 to complete such survey within one year of graduation as
5 a condition of such fellowships. Grantees under section
6 602(b) shall collect and aggregate the survey responses
7 and report the findings to the Secretary annually. The
8 Secretary shall make the results of such survey available
9 to the public.”.

Page 465, line 23, after “issues” insert “and an in-
stitution’s record of placing students into service in areas
of national need, and its stated effort to increase the
number of such students that go into such service”.

Page 479, line 13, insert “(a) USE OF FUNDS.—”
before “The Secretary”; on line 16, strike the close
quotation marks and following period; and after such line
insert the following new subsection:

10 “(b) BIENNIAL REPORT.—The Secretary shall, in
11 consultation and collaboration with the Department of
12 Commerce, Department of Defense, Department of State,
13 Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and Na-
14 tional Security Agency, and other relevant Federal agen-
15 cies, submit a biennial report that identifies areas of na-
16 tional need in foreign language, area, and international

1 studies as such studies relate to government, education,
2 business, and nonprofit needs, and a plan to address those
3 needs. The report shall be provided to the authorizing
4 committees and made available to the public.”.

Page 740, line 6, strike “and”, and after line 6, insert the following new paragraph (and redesignate the succeeding paragraph accordingly):

5 “(4) consult with head officials of a wide range
6 of Federal departments and agencies, including the
7 Department of Commerce, the Department of De-
8 fense, the Department of State, the Office of the Di-
9 rector of National Intelligence, and the National Se-
10 curity Agency, to determine the national need for ex-
11 pertise in foreign languages and world regions and
12 to identify how the agencies utilize the expertise and
13 resources of grantees receiving funds under title VI
14 of the Higher Education Act of 1965; and
