

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5658, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MS. BERKLEY OF NEVADA**

At the end of title X, add the following (and conform the table of contents of the bill accordingly):

1 **SEC. ____ . THEME STUDY FOR COMMEMORATING AND IN-**
2 **TERPRETING THE COLD WAR.**

3 (a) **DEFINITIONS.**—In this section:

4 (1) **ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**—The term “Advi-
5 sory Committee” means the Cold War Advisory
6 Committee established under subsection (c).

7 (2) **THEME STUDY.**—The term “theme study”
8 means the national historic landmark theme study
9 conducted under subsection (b)(1).

10 (b) **COLD WAR THEME STUDY.**—

11 (1) **IN GENERAL.**—The Secretary of the Inte-
12 rior shall conduct a national historic landmark
13 theme study to identify sites and resources in the
14 United States that are significant to the Cold War.

15 (2) **RESOURCES.**—In conducting the theme
16 study, the Secretary of the Interior shall consider—

17 (A) the inventory of sites and resources as-
18 sociated with the Cold War completed by the
19 Secretary of Defense under section 8120(b)(9)

1 of the Department of Defense Appropriations
2 Act, 1991 (Public Law 101-511; 104 Stat.
3 1906); and

4 (B) historical studies and research of Cold
5 War sites and resources, including—

6 (i) intercontinental ballistic missiles;

7 (ii) flight training centers;

8 (iii) manufacturing facilities;

9 (iv) communications and command
10 centers (such as Cheyenne Mountain, Colo-
11 rado);

12 (v) defensive radar networks (such as
13 the Distant Early Warning Line);

14 (vi) nuclear weapons test sites (such
15 as the Nevada test site); and

16 (vii) strategic and tactical aircraft.

17 (3) CONTENTS.—The theme study shall in-
18 clude—

19 (A) recommendations for commemorating
20 and interpreting sites and resources identified
21 by the theme study, including—

22 (i) sites for which studies for potential
23 inclusion in the National Park System
24 should be authorized;

1 (ii) sites for which new national his-
2 toric landmarks should be nominated; and

3 (iii) other appropriate designations;

4 (B) recommendations for cooperative
5 agreements with—

6 (i) State and local governments;

7 (ii) local historical organizations; and

8 (iii) other appropriate entities; and

9 (C) an estimate of the amount required to
10 carry out the recommendations under subpara-
11 graphs (A) and (B).

12 (4) CONSULTATION.—In conducting the theme
13 study, the Secretary of the Interior shall consult
14 with—

15 (A) the Secretary of the Air Force;

16 (B) State and local officials;

17 (C) State historic preservation offices; and

18 (D) other interested organizations and in-
19 dividuals.

20 (5) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the
21 date on which funds are made available to carry out
22 this section, the Secretary of the Interior shall sub-
23 mit to the Committee on Resources of the House of
24 Representatives and the Committee on Energy and
25 Natural Resources of the Senate a report that de-

1 scribes the findings, conclusions, and recommenda-
2 tions of the theme study.

3 (c) COLD WAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—

4 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—As soon as practicable
5 after funds are made available to carry out this sec-
6 tion, the Secretary of the Interior shall establish an
7 advisory committee, to be known as the “Cold War
8 Advisory Committee”, to assist the Secretary of the
9 Interior in carrying out this section.

10 (2) COMPOSITION.—The Advisory Committee
11 shall be composed of 9 members, to be appointed by
12 the Secretary of the Interior, of whom—

13 (A) 3 shall have expertise in Cold War his-
14 tory;

15 (B) 2 shall have expertise in historic pres-
16 ervation;

17 (C) 1 shall have expertise in the history of
18 the United States; and

19 (D) 3 shall represent the general public.

20 (3) CHAIRPERSON.—The Advisory Committee
21 shall select a chairperson from among the members
22 of the Advisory Committee.

23 (4) COMPENSATION.—A member of the Advi-
24 sory Committee shall serve without compensation
25 but may be reimbursed by the Secretary of the Inte-

1 prior for expenses reasonably incurred in the perform-
2 ance of the duties of the Advisory Committee.

3 (5) MEETINGS.—On at least 3 occasions, the
4 Secretary of the Interior (or a designee) shall meet
5 and consult with the Advisory Committee on matters
6 relating to the theme study.

7 (d) INTERPRETIVE HANDBOOK ON THE COLD
8 WAR.—Not later than 4 years after the date on which
9 funds are made available to carry out this section, the Sec-
10 retary of the Interior shall—

11 (1) prepare and publish an interpretive hand-
12 book on the Cold War; and

13 (2) disseminate information in the theme study
14 by other appropriate means.

15 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
16 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
17 \$500,000.
